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

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
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FOREWORD




I am thankful to all those members, who in one or the other form, helped us in the development of this book.

Dear Teacher

This book has been especially designed for your pupils. It attempts to turn an area of work, traditionally considered to be tedious, into an interesting, stimulating and relevant experience. This book integrates the environmental themes with systematic practice in writing skills through a variety of purposeful writing tasks.

A special feature of this book is to focus on practicing writing in a graded manner. Many activities have been designed such as colouring, drawing, matching etc. Such activities enable children to be able to establish eye-hand co-ordination and develop cognitive skills.

The language component of this book has been treated phonetically. In this class, initial and last sound of the words and vowel sounds have been stressed upon.

As far as possible, the contents and activities of this book have been kept as per the age level of this children. At the time of designing of this book special attention has been given to see that the sequence of this book corresponds to that of the units of the text (*My English Book*).

EXPERIMENTS WITH WATER



FOR THE TEACHER

Take a tub full of water. Give children some objects such as leaf, pen, stones, paper boat, coin, spoon etc. to put in the water. Tell them to observe the things that sink in water and the things that float on water.

Discuss with the children of your class what happens when water is put in the freezer, heated on fire and kept in the sun.



Take two tubs full of water. Tell children to wash their hands after lunch in one tub and keep away the second tub. Then show them the difference between dirty and clean water (colour, smell).
