

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

Foreword







I would welcome suggestions for its improvement from my fellow teachers and parents.



Sense organs help us to sense and understand things around us.



NOSE

We have one nose. Nose helps us to smell different things. We also breathe through our nose.





TONGUE

EARS


We have two ears. Ears help us to hear different sounds.

Our skin helps us to feel the difference between hard and soft and hot and cold objects.




A C T I V I T Y
